Mayor Novak reminded the members that Police Negotiations is scheduled for Thursday, April 27th at 1:00 p.m.

1. Street Sign Updates

Mayor Novak explained the need to replace the street signs in the City, due to needing to be in compliance with federal highway standards. The old street signs have been taken to Time and Again Vintage to be sold for \$20 each, retaining a 20% commission, and they have already sold 184 signs and 7 brackets. The City portion of the funds will be applied to the new street signs. Julie Crubaugh and Terry Olson of Time and Again Vintage have generously donated \$400 from the their commission to the Prairie Fire Children's Theatre Recreation Summer Program. Mayor Novak thanked Julie and Terry for their donation.

B. Library

1. Library 2016 Annual Report

Dodgeville Public Library Director Vickie Stangel presented her 2016 Annual Library Report and Summary Statement. She provided different statistics and explained to the Council how their collections are changing. The electronic collection numbers are increasing dramatically. The current hours of operation are Monday through Thursday 10am-7pm, Friday 10am-6pm, and Satruday 9am-1pm for a total of 2,496 open hours annually. They have had multiple requests for being open earlier and also staying open later. The biggest challenge for the library is the lack of space. It has been recommended that the facility should be 27,000 square feet and the current space is just over 6,000 square feet. Five years ago, the Dodgeville Public Library was the largest library in Iowa County. After the Dodgeville School construction project is completed, they will be the fourth largest following Mineral Point, Barneveld, and the Dodgeville Media Center. When reviewing the occupancy numbers and questions regarding occupancy limits, Vickie stated their highest count was 94 people entering in an hour and that there are only 37 seats available in the current space. Another challenge is that the increase in electronic circulation requires more staff availability. The City allocation of \$272,344 mostly pays for salaries and wages. There will be a decrease of over \$1,000 from County funds next year. Federal funding is being threatened also. Federal grant monies were approved, but monies have not been disbursed and may not be released. Concerns are being discussed as to how to adjust to the decreases. The need for tech savvy staff is needed for the increase in the electronic collections. A new library mobile app will be released soon. Dodgeville elementary students are coming for an annual visit and getting library cards. St. Joe's continues to make weekly visits. Vickie voiced safety concerns for patrons and staff during the time frames when City Hall is closed - outside lighting, side door accessibility, fire safety, and response plans for emergency situations. Several area groups utilize the library space for meetings (i.e. Caregiver Support Group, Iowa County Dementia Coalition, Genealogy Group).

3. Farmer's Savings Bank Interest Payment

Clerk Lisa Riley updated the Council regarding an interest payment of \$16,488.98 received from Farmers Savings Bank (December 2015 - March 2017) for the difference owed, per the agreement at renewal. Farmers Savings Bank committed to .25% above the LGIP monthly rate. For the past few years, the LGIP rate had been stagnant at .14% but fluctuated monthly during this time period. The interest payment for the General Fund was \$13,125.64 and \$3,363.34 for the Tax Fund for the months of January-March 2016, December 2016-February 2017. Bank President Joe Witmer contacted Clerk Lisa Riley to notify the City of the error and immediately corrected the oversight.

completing the repairs to the apron. Brian presented his concerns with the Fire Department Billing Ordinance, drafted by Attorney Brownlee. He stated that our billing company, Cvikota, is requesting such an ordinance to support their billing. The item has been tabled until further review of the current contracts with the Townships. The Council thanked Brian for his report.
