B. Economic Development Specialist

1. March-April Report from Phyllis Fritsch

Phyllis Fritsch, Economic Development Specialist, hired by Southwestern WI Regional Planning Commission introduced herself and distributed business cards to Council members. Phyllis has been on the job approximately 6 weeks. She provided an activity report for March 7 - 31, 2016 and April, 2016. She updated the Council on several things happening in Dodgeville: A few highlights were the New Horizons remodel of the vehicle car wash along with relocation of diesel gas pumps and a new kitchen and food area which will be opening this month; construction on a 24-apartment complex across from Upland Hills Health; plans for remodeling and expanding the local library; established business looking for property to continue expansion; positive report that she suggested the Council view the MadREP survey report for 1st quarter of 2015 posted in January of 2016, which is favorable for Dodgeville; and a new title company. Phyllis reminded everyone that the annual WI Grilled Cheese Championship is in Dodgeville on April 23rd. She thanked the Chamber of Commerce for sponsoring the event. Phyllis is working with a local employer on grant funding to increase broadband. She is working with a company in mid-Wisconsin to feature Dodgeville in its catalog that is distributed nationally and internationally in early 2017. She also reported that the hospital will begin preparations for remodeling. Currently, there are only 2 open business properties in the downtown area. Phyllis is creating a list of commercial properties available and an inventory list of inquiries about commercial properties. An empty storefront costs a community an average \$76,000 annually in lost economies. In reviewing the Comprehensive Plans and other reports for the City, there is a definite need to update the City's Comprehensive Plan. Mayor Novak is in discussion with SWWRPC for assistance with this project.

Mayor Novak commented that Phyllis has hit the ground running and is very impressed with the contacts she has already made with people. He agreed with Phyllis in the need to update the 1991 Comprehensive Plan. The Council thanked Phyllis for her report. Mayor Novak stated he would like to see a quarterly report from Phyllis, similar to the cycle with Fire, EMS, and Police.

E. Park and Recreation Committee

1. Harris Park Concession Stand Bids

Bids came in higher than initially anticipated. Mayor Novak does not feel we can afford both Harris Park projects. Other projects also talked about at budget time were items like bleachers, etc. Discussion followed regarding the need for the City to budget for building a storage building. The Concessions Building will have a 24' X 24' open area on each end, along with roughly 24' x 24' concessions area in the middle. Ald. Sersch commented he would like to see the City contribute toward the cost of the storage building. Ald. Borne stated he felt the Concession Building follows the intentions and guidelines of the Herb & Irene Harris Park Fund. Motion by Ald. Borne to award the 2016 Harris Park Concessions Building bid to Otter Creek Construction for \$82,200 with monies coming from the larger H & I Harris Fund. Second by Ald. James. Roll Call: Ald. Mayor Novak reminded the Council of the upcoming Local Government 101 seminar, sponsored by the League of WI Municipalities.

2. Brown Street Sewer Main-Lift Station Elimination

Greg Lee and Ben Heidemann from Town & Country Engineering presented information regarding cash flow analysis for the elimination of the Brown Street Lift Station. When previously reviewed, a sewer rate increase of \$6.75 (rate of \$39.12) was discussed. Ben reviewed the total available carryover and stated the City wants to maintain the general rule of thumb of 25% of annual operating expenses. The estimated project for elimination of the Brown Street Lift Station is approximately \$240,000, with an anticipated 5 year note at 1.3%. After reviewing the additional costs and cash analysis, the sewer rate increase would be \$6.90 for a total of \$39.61. Ben stated he wants to review the Sewer

Replacement Fund monies available. They will need to review the 2015 audit numbers, once available.

3. 2440: WWTP and SCADA Upgrades-Permission to Bid

Total project budget cost is \$3.7 million (\$3.3 million plus contingency). WI DNR has not distributed information well about the upcoming June 30th deadline, so they are being lenient with submissions this year. Town & Country is planning on submitting to DNR in mid-July. Ben is looking for bids to be due approximately June 1st or 2nd, unless contractors need additional time. Motion by Ald. Forseth to go out to bid for Wastewater Treatment Plant and SCADA upgrades.
